Dear Danville Families,

The 2020-2021 school year opened under the threat and uncertainty of COVID-19. At DASD our families and students have been at the heart of our decisions regarding creating varied instructional models; limiting the number of students in the building; contact tracing and quarantining students; and keeping schools in-person or going virtual for a short period of time. Fortunately, DASD has been able to provide the majority of our students with the opportunity for in-person learning throughout the first marking period. We have been faced with many challenges during this time. Due to the patience of our families, the care and dedication of our staff, and the support of the School Board, we have been able to keep schools open.

Last week we provided families and staff the opportunity to complete a survey regarding the next few weeks of school in relation to the holiday breaks. Nearly 40% of our families responded that they will be either visiting or hosting guests during the holidays. The number of active COVID cases in our area is at the highest rate ever and has been climbing daily during this month. Looking at the data from the surveys, PDE, and the Department of Health (DOH), the administrative team has made the difficult decision to move from an in-person model to a virtual learning model over the next week.

On Wednesday, November 10th, we had to send home nearly 40 students from two primary classrooms and one Head Start classroom due to two positive cases. Also, the decision was made to move Danville Middle School to an every other day model starting Monday, November 16th. As you can see, regardless of our mitigation efforts, masks, and social distancing, COVID-19 is invading the school through community spread and parents and other adults testing positive.

Beginning Thursday, November 19th (half day AM), all of our DASD students will move to attending school remotely through virtual learning. Students who are currently using the Bridge model or the Ironmen Cyber Academy/eLearning model will continue to access their present systems. All other students who are currently attending our traditional/in-person learning model will then be instructed virtually through Google Meet/Google Classroom.

The schedule will be as follows:

November 19, 20, 23, 24: Virtual Learning
November 25 – 27: Thanksgiving Break (**NO SCHOOL**)
November 30: Act 80 day (**NO SCHOOL**)
December 1, 2, 3, 4: Virtual Learning
December 7 – 22:
DPS & LV Traditional Students Return to School Daily (*tentatively*)
DMS & DHS Traditional Students return to every other day hybrid model (*tentatively*)
December 23 – January 1: Holiday Break (**NO SCHOOL**)
January 4 – 8: Virtual Learning

Food Service will continue to provide breakfast and lunch meals for pick up. We will be providing specifics through the DASD global connect system early next week.

We understand the impact that this has on families, but we also realize the great responsibility we have to do our best to create a safe environment for our children and staff. This plan is designed to allow a period of time around each holiday break utilizing virtual learning. Our intent is to use this time to monitor the spread of cases and potential cases to protect the health and well-being of our community. We have planned in-person instructional days during December because we understand the importance of children being in school. Please know that this plan for in-person days is our hope. We will be monitoring current data in Pennsylvania, Montour and Northumberland Counties, and our local communities and will make adjustments as warranted.

This decision is not one that has been made lightly. Teachers and administrators have learned a great deal about virtual learning over the past 45 days. DASD teachers are the heart and soul of our district and are committed to your children and their success. With this plan they will have the opportunity to teach from their classrooms during all virtual sessions, providing students some level of normalcy during this difficult time.

In an effort to help you with the virtual learning process we are including building specific information with a calendar for your reference. We will be providing an opportunity for parents to ask questions through a Zoom Question and Answer session on Monday, November 23rd at 5:30 PM. This session will also be broadcast live on YouTube. Information on accessing this event will be posted on the main DASD webpage.

This action is to put the health and safety of the DASD community first and to do everything possible to slow the spread of the coronavirus. In public education, planning is paramount to providing the very best instruction for our students. At this time we are planning for an unpredictable future to the best of our abilities.

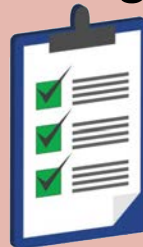
